

5 Starter Facts About Christianity

- Christianity is the largest world religion, with over 2 billion followers worldwide 1/3 of the global population – and ~230 million in the United States – 71% of the national population.
- 2. There are thousands of denominations, or branches, of Christianity. But the common thread is being a monotheistic religion and the belief Jesus Christ is the Messiah, or savior. Christians believe he sacrificed so that mankind can be forgiven for their sins.
- 3. Jesus was crucified on a cross, making it the most holy symbol among Christians. The most important holiday, Easter, celebrates his resurrection.
- 4. The Christian Bible comprises the Old Testament (the Jewish Torah) and the New Testament. A common divergence amongst denominations is the degree of adherence to it.
- 5. Central teachings revolve around sin and salvation. Followers believe mankind can only be forgiven through repentance and belief in Christ as the messiah.
