Lifting and Dressing a Sefer Torah

Na la'amod l'hag'ba'at v'lig'lilat...

haSefer haRishon	First	הַסֵּפֶר הַרִאשׁוֹן
haSefer haSheini	Second	הַסֵּפֶר הַשֵּׁנִי
ha Sefer haShlishi	Third	הַסֵּפֶר הַשְּׁלִישִׁי

*The inclusion of (a) Hebrew name(s) is(are) optional.

This gender-inclusive language applies to both individuals and to groups.

We refer to the *aliyah* rather than the individuals(s) called up to do the b'rachot.
