May God grant me strength, courage and peace. Amen.



# FIRST IMMERSION

Slowly descend the steps into the mikveh waters and immerse completely so that every part of your body is covered by the warm water.

When you emerge, recite the following blessing:

בְּרוּךְ אַתָּה, יְיָ Baruch atah, Adonai בְּלֵהְינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הְעוֹלָם Eloheinu, Melech ha'olam אַשֶּׁר קִדְשְׁנוּ בִּשְבִילָה asher kidshanu bi-t'vilah b'mayyim hayyim.

Blessed are You, God, Majestic Spirit of the Universe who makes us holy by embracing us in living waters.

# SECOND IMMERSION

Read before you immerse:

To take the first step
To sing a new song—
Is to close one's eyes
and dive
into unknown waters.
For a moment knowing nothing risking all
But then to discover
The waters are friendly
The ground is firm.

And the song—

the song rises again.2

Take a deep breath and exhale completely, while gently and completely immersing for the second time.

### THIRD IMMERSION

Read before you immerse:

Hineni. Here I stand, on my way to \_\_\_\_\_\_, knowing I can create a full life for myself, knowing that I have a circle of loved and loving ones who will celebrate my endeavors, knowing that I am sheltered beneath the wings of the *Shechinah*, knowing my own power.<sup>3</sup>

Relax, and let your body soften, as you slowly and completely immerse for the third time.

When you emerge, recite the following blessing:

, בְּרוּךְ אַתְּה, יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הְעוֹלָם Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech ha'olam הַ בּרוּךְ אַתְּה, יְיָ אֱלֹהֵינוּ, מֶלֶדְ הָנוּ, וְהִגִּיאַנוּ לַזִּמֵן הַזֶּה. shehecheyanu, v'kiy'manu, v'higianu la'zman hazeh.

Blessed are You, Eternal our God, for giving me life, sustaining me, and through one miracle after another, bringing me to this moment.<sup>4</sup>
